# What Does 'Dipped' Mean For C8 Corvette Interiors?



The <u>C8 Corvette</u> offers a plethora of customization opportunities, including several different color options for the exterior and interior. For those customers looking to customize the cabin, the term "dipped" is likely to find its way into the conversation. But what the heck does dipped even mean for the C8 <u>Corvette</u> interior?

Natural Dipped interior
Essentially, the term dipped as it relates to the C8 Corvette interior options is a reference to a single, uniform color scheme. The concept gives the impression that the interior has been fully immersed – or "dipped" – in a specific color, delivering a cohesive aesthetic.



This term is applied liberally across the Corvette interior color option list. A few examples would include the Adrenaline Red Dipped (red), Natural Dipped (tan), and Artemis (green), all of which showcase a seamless, monochromatic style. That said, there is some grey area to the term, most notably with the Tension Blue / Twilight Blue Dipped option, which features a two-tone blue layout matching black and blue. Then we have the Artemis interior colorway, which is monotone, but does not include the dipped term in the name.

### Adrenaline Red Dipped interior

The dipped aesthetic lends the C8 Corvette interior a more uniform look, which may be exactly what some customers are after. By contrast, the two-tone interior colorways are more disjointed and busier looking, lending a more technical appearance overall.



Tension Blue / Twilight Blue Dipped interior

Going with a two-tone colorway rather than a monochromatic dipped colorway tends to accentuate the C8 Corvette's driver-focused layout, which has remained consistent since the model's 2020 debut. With its prominent digital display, ergonomic wide center console, and a thin ridge of buttons placed along the upper edge of the center console, the C8's interior places a huge amount of emphasis on cradling the driver, as one might expect from a modern sports car. Meanwhile, the dipped interior colorways bring the driver's side and passenger's side of the cabin together, at least visually.

### **A Piece of History**

# 1968 Astro II and Engineering Blueprint

Long before the reveal of the C8 Corvette Stingray, General Motors was experimenting with midengine sports car designs. One of these concept cars was the 1967 Astro I, a low, sleek, futuristic-looking automobile created primarily as a styling exercise. The experiment convinced GM to build another mid-engine concept with greater potential to be a production automobile. Initially called XP-880, this next car would eventually become the 1968 Astro II, the first true mid-engine Corvette prototype. It is currently on display at the National Corvette Museum on loan from GM.

Frank Winchell, who oversaw Chevrolet's Research and Development department, led the engineering of the Astro II. Winchell and Larry Nies equipped the car with a 427 cubic inch V8, which produced 400 horsepower. Nies chose to mount this engine backward within the car, allowing more room to install the alternator, water pump, and other equipment. Winchell's team also built the Astro II's steel frame and rear suspension components, supplementing the front half of the chassis with off the shelf parts. To assist with the creation of the vehicle, Chevrolet's R&D department drafted this engineering

blueprint for the Astro II's internal components. Donated by Dana Forrester, the blueprint is now part of the Museum's archival collections.

Winchell requested that Larry Shinoda design the Astro II's body. Shinoda previously worked on Corvette concepts like the XP-819 and Mako Shark II. His design for the Astro II features his famous "coke-bottle" styling with smooth fender flares. The car has traditional doors, a larger front storage unit, and a clamshell bonnet for accessing the engine. The rear of the Astro II includes the customary four Corvette taillights, a sugar scoop rear window, and a series of vents for better airflow. Inside, the car is similar to the third-generation Corvette. However, the Astro II did not include the C3's chrome bumpers or flip-up headlights. Shinoda's design blended the front and rear fascia seamlessly into the body.

Ultimately, the Astro II did not go into production. GM was unwilling to risk transitioning the Corvette to a mid-engine layout, particularly since the C3 was selling well. Nevertheless, the Astro II's innovative engineering and influential design make it one of the most successful Corvette concepts ever produced.

### Chevrolet announces 2025 Corvette ZR1 pricing

Chevrolet announced pricing for the fastest, quickest and most powerful Corvette ever. With a top speed of 233 mph on the track, 0-60 in 2.3 seconds1 and 1,064 horsepower, the Corvette ZR1 is unrivaled by any current production car priced under \$1 million.

The announcement comes on the eve of the Detroit Auto Show, which gets underway on Friday. All four major General Motors brands – Chevrolet, Cadillac, GMC, and Buick – will be participating in the show.

Chevrolet will begin accepting orders for the 2025 Corvette ZR1 in mid-February, at a starting MSRP\* of \$174,995 (including \$1,695 DFC) for the 1LZ coupe and \$184,995 (including DFC) for the 1LZ hardtop convertible. The 2025 Corvette ZR1 is available in two trims – 1LZ and 3LZ. All 2025 ZR1s come standard with:

- A hand-assembled 1,064 hp twin-turbo V8 engine
- Visible carbon fiber roof
- Carbon ceramic brakes
- Performance Data Recorder
- Carbon fiber ground effects and side intakes

"ZR1 is an example of design and engineering excellence, one where we push the boundaries of what's possible in terms of performance," said Scott Bell, vice president of global Chevrolet. "It was important for us to stay true to Corvette's promise of a vehicle whose world-class capabilities completely outmatch its price."

### Performance Options

The ZR1 Carbon Fiber Aero Package (TOM), with an MSRP of \$8,495, replaces the standard aero package and adds an aggressive, high-downforce rear wing, front dive planes, and a tall hood spoiler. The package also adds underbody strakes to increase downforce.

The ZTK Performance Package (ZTK), with an MSRP of \$1,500, requires the Carbon Fiber Aero Package to unlock the ultimate track configuration.

The 3LZ coupe is available for a starting MSRP\* of \$185,995 (including DFC) or \$195,995 (including DFC) for the 3LZ convertible. Production of the 2025 Corvette ZR1 will begin at Bowling Green Assembly in Q2. Those interested in purchasing should work with their preferred Corvette dealer for ordering details.



# **How The 2025 Corvette ZR1 Price Stacks Up to Its Competitors**



Just yesterday, GM announced official <u>pricing figures for the new 2025 Corvette ZR1</u>. As expected, the new <u>ZR1</u> is the most expensive model in the <u>C8</u> lineup, starting at \$174,995, including \$1,695 for destination freight charge. However, even at that price point, the 2025 ZR1 is actually surprisingly affordable, at least compared to the competition.

Below, you'll find a pricing breakdown for rivals to the <u>2025 Corvette</u> ZR1. Highlights include the 2024 Porsche 911 GT3 RS (\$241,300), the 2025 Ford Mustang GTD (\$325,000, est.), the 2022

McLaren 765LT (\$382,500), the 2024 Ferrari SF90 XX (\$\$528,764), and the 2025 Lamborghini Revuelto (\$608,358), all of which are significantly more expensive than the new ZR1.

### 1. GM-designated Corvette ZR1 rival

Of course, even with the relatively low price tag, the C8 <u>Corvette</u> ZR1 doesn't skimp on speed. Just behind the cabin, you'll find the twin-turbocharged <u>5.5L V8 LT7</u> gasoline engine, which is rated at 1,064 horsepower at 7,000 rpm and 828 pound-feet of torque at 6,000 rpm. Properly applied, it's enough giddy-up to send the ZR1 all the way to over 230 mph, as <u>demonstrated by GM President</u>, Mark Reuss.

*GM Authority* previously provided a comparison of top speed and engine output between the ZR1 and a selection of the top performance machines currently on the market. Indeed, when compared to ultra-high-dollar machines like the Rimac Nevera (\$2,160,000, est.) or Bugatti W16 Mistral (\$5,400,000, est.), \$175,000 for a new ZR1 seems like a steal.

"With a top speed of 233 mph on the track, 0-60 in 2.3 seconds and 1,064 horsepower, the Corvette ZR1 is unrivaled by any current production car priced under \$1 million," Chevy boasts.

Notably, the new C8 ZR1 is also available with optional extras like the ZR1 Carbon Fiber Aero Package (RPO code TOM), which tacks on an additional \$8,495 in exchange for downforce-increasing items like a large rear wing, front dive planes, and a hood spoiler.

As a reminder, all C8 variants are built on the GM Y2 platform and are produced at the GM Bowling Green plant in Kentucky. Orders for the C8 ZR1 open in February, with production kicking off in Q2.



## **C8 Corvette ZR1 Will Have A Longer Run Than C7 ZR1: Exclusive**

GM just released official <u>pricing information</u> for the new C8 <u>Corvette ZR1</u>, announcing a starting MSRP just under \$175,000. The new <u>C8</u> ZR1 is the latest range-topping model in the C8 lineup, offered as the fastest, most powerful production Vette ever made. Critically, the new C8 ZR1 will have a longer production run than the preceding <u>C7</u> ZR1.

During a recent interview with Chevy Corvette Product Marketing Manager <u>Harlan Charles</u>, *GM Authority* Executive Editor <u>Alex Luft</u> asked if the C8 Corvette ZR1 will enjoy a longer production run than the C7 ZR1.

"I think that's probably fair to say, since the C7 ran for just two years at the end of its life cycle," Charles told *GM Authority*.

The C7 ZR1 was introduced for the 2019 model year, and at the time was framed as the most powerful production Vette ever. Highlights included the supercharged <u>6.2L V8 LT5</u>, rated at 755 horsepower and 715 pound-feet of torque, as well as more aggressive aerodynamics, unique chassis and suspension tuning, and other go-fast goodies.

However, the C7-generation Corvette ZR1 was only available for a single model year before its discontinuation immediately before the the launch of the next-generation C8 for the 2020 model year. Looking ahead, we expect the C8 ZR1 to be offered through at least the 2027 model year, though it will likely live even longer than that.

Given the C8 Corvette ZR1 will be in production for longer than the preceding C7 ZR1 and will therefore be "available" for longer, it reasons to assume that the C8 ZR1 will be "easier" to buy, despite the fact that the C8 ZR1 is substantially more expensive than the C7 ZR1.



For reference, GM has offered a ZR1 variant across five total Corvette generations, including the C3, C4, C6, C7, and C8. The latest C8 Corvette ZR1 variant cradles the twin-turbocharged <u>5.5L</u> V8 LT7 gasoline engine, which is rated at 1,064 horsepower and 828 pound-feet of torque.

Every C8 variant is built of the GM Y2 platform, with production taking place at the <u>GM Bowling</u> <u>Green plant</u> in Kentucky.

### Corvette Coupe and Convertible Rank High in Study of Most Loved Sports Cars



That long-term ownership says as much about the person as it does the car, but a <u>recent survey by iSeeCars</u> sought to determine scientifically with their "Most-Loved Sports Cars" ranking just how much the original owners of sports cars from around the globe really, really, really like their vehicles.

Of course, there's no absolutely scientific way to determine such a subjective factor, but iSeeCars did enough research to find out the percentage of 15-year-old cars that are still possessed by their original owner, hence giving a somewhat accurate indication of their satisfaction with their vehicles.

If you're a fan of this website, it should come as no surprise to you that the Chevrolet Corvette coupe ranks #4 on this list with 3.2% of the original owners still in possession while the convertible version comes in at #6 at 2.5%.

Topping the list is the Mazda MX-5 Miata at 5.0%, followed by the #2 Dodge Challenger at 4.6% and the #3 Audi TT coupe at 4.0%.

# 2025 Corvette Exterior Colors Ranked Through January 4th





I was talking with a friend about the new <u>2025 Corvette colors</u> this morning when he tells me that my beloved Hysteria Purple Metallic is a low seller so far for the year. In fact, I was told my E-Ray was going to be incredibly rare because nobody is ordering the new color. Well, them are fighting words where I come from! Now that I have a stake in the game, I set out to prove him wrong.

It was time for some 2025 data mining, and our friends at <a href="CStracker.com">CStracker.com</a> offer the ability to see all kinds of stats from the Corvette window stickers including the exteriors. We went through and grabbed the totals for each of the colors to create this chart below showing the current quantities of each color ranked by sales.

There really is no surprise with the top end of the chart. White, Black, Torch Red, and Red Mist have been running in that same order for several years now, while Sea Wolf Gray has taken the place for the previous Silver and Hypersonic Gray to hold the 5th position for the year.

After that we have the two blues and the three new colors. The new colors appear to be doing alright with Hysteria Purple showing a 7.8% take rate and just 19 cars behind Riptide Blue. Competition Yellow is also doing well with 7% of exteriors painted in the new Yellow. If you remember, Accelerate Yellow was always a 2% color.

Retail production of Sebring Orange didn't start the week of October 28th which explains why the former popular color is showing dead last in this count. However, once it came online, it's beat Rapid Blue each and every week and so we expect Sebring Orange to eventually overtake Rapid Blue in the coming months.

# 2025 Corvette ZR1 1LZ And 3LZ: Quick Interior Comparison

General Motors <u>pulled the wrapper</u> off the 2025 <u>Corvette ZR1</u> last July, showing off the fastest, most powerful production <u>Corvette</u> ever made. As one might expect, the 2025 ZR1 presents a striking exterior design that helps to identify it as the top dog in the <u>C8</u> lineup. In addition, the <u>2025 Corvette</u> ZR1 looks quite good inside as well, and now, we're doing a quick cabin design comparison between two ZR1 trim levels, namely the new ZR1 1LZ and ZR1 3LZ. At first glance, the 2025 Corvette ZR1 cabin design looks similar to that of the rest of the C8 lineup, with a driver-focused layout that surrounds the lucky individual in the hot seat with an array of buttons and screens. The digital display behind the dash and adjacent to the steering wheel are tilted towards the driver, while the steering wheel itself includes two spokes and a flattened bottom and top. Also notable is a ZR1 logo at the bottom of the steering wheel.

However, looking more closely, we can identify some major design differences between the ZR1 1LZ and ZR1 3LZ trims. For example, the 3LZ is equipped with a microfiber and carbon fiber rimmed steering wheel, whereas the 1LZ's steering wheel is covered in leather.

The seats are also a major point of departure for these two trims. The seats in the 3LZ offer heating and ventilation features, whereas the 1LZ does not. Both trims get eight-way power-adjustable seats, while the 3LZ adds power lumbar support and power bolster support. Finally, the 1LZ offers GT1 or Competition seats, while the 3LZ offers GT2 or Competition seats.

Also notable is the trim, with the 3LZ equipped with carbon fiber and leather-wrapped IP/console/door panels with sueded microfiber upper trim, whereas the 1LZ does not. Finally, on the infotainment spec, the 3LZ is

equipped with a 14-speaker Bose Performance Series surround system, while the 1LZ gets 10-speaker Bose Premium system.

# Some 2024 Corvette Units Will Need A Front Camera Module Replacement

Cold weather will cause the front camera module of certain <u>2024 Corvette</u> cars to become inoperative after the vehicle has sat in the cold for a while, according to a new service bulletin issued by GM.

General Motors Service Bulletin number N242453430 applies both to 2024 <u>Corvette</u> units owned by customers that are brought back to the dealership and those that are still in dealership inventory at the current time.



The service bulletin doesn't specify which variants of the 2024 Corvette are included, so the bulletin presumably applies to the 2024 Chevy Corvette Stingray, the 2024 Chevy Corvette E-Ray, and the 2024 Chevy Corvette Z06. Affected vehicles are marked as "Open" on their Investigate Vehicle History screen in the warranty management system.

The remedy to be applied is to replace the front view camera module with a new module that doesn't have the issue with cold. The process is relatively quick for the <a href="Chevy">Chevy</a> Corvette, requiring about 24 minutes to complete. The fix is to be applied free of charge if the vehicle is still under New Vehicle Limited Warranty coverage.



Dealership service personnel are also instructed to carry out the fix on all affected 2024 Corvette units currently in the dealership's inventory. These vehicles can't be sold, delivered, traded to other dealerships, auctioned, or demonstrated until the proper fix has been applied. Front camera modules are in limited supply, so they shouldn't be ordered as shelf stock but only to fix a specific affected Vette.

As a reminder, the 2024 Corvette is motivated by the naturally aspirated <u>6.2L V8 LT2</u> gasoline engine developing 490 horsepower and 465 pound-feet of torque for the <u>C8 Stingray</u>, the naturally aspirated <u>5.5L V8 LT6</u> gasoline engine rated at 670 horsepower and 460 pound-feet of torque for the <u>C8 Z06</u>, and the Stingray's V8 LT2 engine plus a front-mounted electric motor providing 655 horsepower for the <u>C8 E-Ray</u>.



All 2024 Corvette models ride on the <u>GM Y2 platform</u> under the body panels. Production of the Vette continues to take place at the <u>GM Bowling Green plant</u> in Kentucky.

### C8 Corvette ZR1 Won't Get A New Interior Just Yet

*GM Authority* has learned that the highly anticipated <u>C8 Corvette ZR1</u> will feature the same cabin design as its sibling models (<u>Corvette C8 Stingray</u>, <u>C8 Z06</u>, and <u>C8 E-Ray</u>), with no major interior changes expected until at least the 2026 model year. Despite initial expectations for a mid-cycle refresh to introduce various interior enhancements in conjunction with the 2025 model year, recent intel indicates that any significant cabin updates are unlikely in the near future.

Back in March, images were posted online showing a 2025-model-year Corvette Z06 parked at the GM Bowling Green facility in Kentucky. The images were quite telling, as they revealed that the 2025 Z06 would continue to incorporate the same interior layout as the current C8. The vehicle seen in the images posted in March was a capture test fleet model, which are typically used to evaluate new and upcoming vehicles by GM employees. That model displayed no signs of the anticipated cabin redesign.

As covered previously, the upcoming <u>C8 Corvette</u> interior overhaul is expected to eliminate the "wall of buttons" included in the current layout, while also redesigning the center console for improved functionality.

The decision to maintain the existing interior through the 2025 model year may disappoint those enthusiasts hoping for a fresh look to accompany the C8 ZR1's enhanced performance. Despite the carryover interior, the upcoming Corvette ZR1 will still introduce significant mechanical upgrades, such as forced-induction variant of the naturally aspirated <u>5.5L V8 LT6</u> engine (dubbed the <u>LT7</u>), which is poised to boost power levels significantly over the Z06's 670 horsepower and 460 pound-feet of torque. Rumor has it the new LT7 will dole out around 850 horsepower.

In addition to a new forced-induction engine, the C8 Corvette ZR1 will also feature major aerodynamic improvements, including <u>new air ducts</u>, an <u>air extractor in the hood</u>, and a <u>massive rear spoiler</u>, the combination of which will ensure the ZR1 remains a top contender in the ultrahigh-performance segment. Look for the C8 ZR1 to <u>debut this Summer</u>.

#### Software updates

- The C8 Corvette can receive software updates over-the-air (OTA) using GM's Global-B electrical architecture.
- In October 2024, Chevrolet issued a Technical Service Bulletin for a software update that
  required a trip to the dealership. The update was intended to improve the software and
  optimize the vehicle for future OTA updates.

### Front fascia and headlights

- The Corvette Action Center has information about adjusting the front fascia and headlights on the 2020–2024 Corvette.
- The 2025 Chevrolet Corvette ZR1 has an LT7 engine that produces 1,064 horsepower and 828 lb-ft of torque. This is the most powerful Corvette ever made by a factory.
